## LEAGUE MATCH REPORTS – SATURDAY 22nd February 2025

Cobham Sports returned from the Island with the three Dorset Premier Football League points on Saturday courtesy of a fine 7-1 win to maintain their pursuit on the league leaders.

Cobham were quickly out of the blocks with Dan Brown testing Portland custodian Alfie Watts from distance in the third minute, but his firm shot was straight at him and then just two minutes later Mike Trim won a header from a corner that just flew over the bar. Cobham weren't allowing Portland to settle, and they took the lead in the 10th minute, Aldo Bertorelli played a lovely ball into the box catching the home defence square and JOSH BUCK was too quick for the keeper and defender and he slotted the ball into the corner. Cobham were in control and Buck brought another save out of Watts in the 13th minute and the pressure began to tell when they increased their lead in the 16th minute, a ball was played into the box and Kingsley Eze-Sunday made a real nuisance of himself to the Portland defence and the loose ball was struck home by ALDO BERTORELLI giving Watts no chance. Cobham maintained their control of the game and Buck saw another shot from distance in the 26th minute but it was straight at Watts, he was at it again ten minutes later, this time his shot on the run brought a really good diving save from Watts and the teams went to the break with Cobham holding a two-goal advantage over the Islanders.

### **HT 0-2**

Cobham started slowly in the second half, giving too much ball away in the midfield just inside their own half and the dangerous Josh Camp had two attempts at goal, the first in the 52nd minute but he was just too high and just three minutes later he headed fractionally over from a corner on the right. Cobham went to the bench and began to settle into their rhythm again and five minutes into his introduction, in the 60th minute, MARCO FOWLER headed home a fine goal from Dan Brown's pinpoint free kick to put Cobham three up, three minutes later Alex Borges broke up a Portland move and his challenge saw the ball breach the square Portland back line and JOSH BUCK was free and rounded the keeper to slot home number four from an acute angle. Cobham introduced Charlie Harries and Adam Priestley in the 65th minute as Cobham were having their best spell of the game, CHARLIE HARRIES did so well in the 72nd minute when played in by Fowler, he appeared to be fouled by the keeper but he still managed to hook the ball into the net from a prostrate position making it 5-0 and then, just a minute later, he was put in down the left and hit a cracking drive which Watts superbly pushed round the post. It was all Cobham now and they increased their lead further in the 76th minute, DAN BROWN scoring direct from a corner and just a minute later, Mike Trim found MARCO FOWLER in space just outside of the box and his shot made it seven

going into the net via the far post. Cobham's finish to the game became a little scrappy and Portland applied some pressure and were rewarded with a goal from the spot in the 90+2nd minute, their standout player JOSH CAMP converting after a clumsy challenge from Mike Trim.

Bournemouth Sports secured an impressive 3-0 away win at Alvington Lane against Westland Sports to keep their title hopes alive in the Dorset Premier Football League.



The game was fairly even in the opening exchanges as both teams weighed each other up. Sam Darlow saw his flicked header from a corner come off the crossbar whilst at the other end the hosts almost took advantage of some hesitation in the Bournemouth defence when a striker lobbed keeper Ryan Knibbs, but saw his effort go narrowly wide. James Bergin saw a great strike from just outside the area following a Bournemouth corner sail agonisingly over whilst Westland Sports had the ball in the net in the 38th minute, but the goal was ruled out for offside. The men from Chapel Gate would break the deadlock just before half time when a great cross from James Bergin was converted at close range by TAYLOR WEBB.

**HT 0-1**

Bournemouth found another level in the second half and went further ahead in the 47th minute when TAYLOR WEBB was played in from a great pass by Sam Darlow and fired past Westland Keeper Harrison Wallis. Indeed, Webb almost completed a hat-trick when his pace got him in on goal in the 55th minute, but on this occasion was denied by a good save from Wallis. The visitors had two great opportunities to go further ahead with both Sam Darlow and Josh Moody seeing efforts go close. However, in the 75th minute central defender CAMERON SHAW headed home a James Bergin corner to secure the points. Josh Moody almost added a 4th heading over from a cross delivered by Sports player coach Joe White. Westland Sports caused a few problems from set pieces during the half by found a stubborn Bournemouth defence difficult to breakdown. The win sees Bournemouth in 3rd place on 56 points, 8 points behind the leaders Dorchester Sports, but with 4 games in hand on them.

Bournemouth Electric welcomed Swanage & Herston FC in the Dorset Premier Football League for their first ever visit to Broadway Park. Overnight rain had put the game in some doubt but by the time kick off arrived it had dried up enough to allow the game to be played.



The first 15 minutes started at a frantic pace for both side, Electric forced an early corner in the first minute when Scott Joyce fed in the lively Jackson on the right whose effort was cleared for a corner which was then cleared only for the Swans to concede another, this time a long cross from the left evaded to Swans defence and SCOTT JOYCE came round the back to plant a firm header in at the far post to give the hosts a deserved lead. Swanage countered and they forced a corner following good work from Cody Moore, the corner was cleared but Electric then conceded a free kick just outside of the box, Ocean Smith shot was deflected past the post leading to another corner this time the corner found its way past Frampton in the Electric goal, and rebounded off the unfortunate Harvey into the net for an OG to draw the sides level. The Swans then suffered an unfortunate set back when Reveanall-Nuete, who had been a handful, was forced off with an injury. The game continued with pace despite the heavy pitch when TINO MAHER extended the Electric lead picking up the ball on the edge of the Swans box danced through five challenges before placing his shot into the far corner.

**HT 2-1**

The Swans came out for the second half with intent to get back in the game and got their reward when the Electric defenders hesitated to clear a cross and allowed MARCUS SMITH to nip between them to equalise at the far post. Swanage continued to press and only some last ditch defending by the central duo of Daysh and Williams kept them out. Electric kept trying to play their style of football and introduced more pace with substitutes. The game turned when again Jackson Kavita burst into the Swans box on the left-hand side and was felled by a Swanage defender, the referee had no hesitation in pointing to the spot, KANE DAYSH stepped up to restore the Electric lead. Further chances fell to both sides, Kareem for Electric could have scored for the hosts. And, but for Frampton in the home goal, Swanage could have perhaps equalised in the dying minutes.

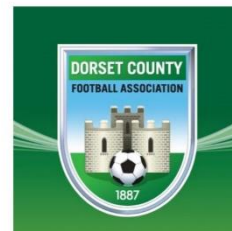
There were very contrasting styles of play on display with the build-up, lay out from the back of Hamworthy Utd against the direct counter attacking from Bridport. Within the first 2 minutes of kick off Hamworthy's Bailey Rowe found himself one v one with the Bridport goalkeeper, Archie Kershaw, who held his ground well to deny an early lead for the hammers. It was however Bridport that took the early lead, when a freekick to the left-hand side of the box was whipped in by Ash Smith for it to be met by the head of Harry Burwood, which saw it crash off the far side post only for it to rebound in off a Hamworthy Utd Player for an own goal. The rest of the half was limited to half chance for both teams with Bridport happy to sit in and protect their goal advantage to half time

**HT 0-1**

A change in shape and personnel in the 2nd half had Hamworthy Utd dominate large spells of the game in the Bridport half and could have scored early on with several good chances if it wasn't for the heroics of Archie Kershaw between the sticks. Mounting pressure was building and the defending from Bridport started to get deeper when Neemo Nixon drove into the area and drilled in a low rifling shot towards the back post for BAILEY ROWE to tap in for an equaliser in the 77th minute. Not taking the foot of the gas, Hamworthy kept pushing and in the 88th minute Oli Robertson latched onto a threaded through ball and with a well driven shot rebounding off the post it looked like the game was headed for a score draw. It wasn't until all 90 minutes had been played when the action heated up when a push on Oli Robertson inside the box in the 91st minute gave little choice but for the referee to award Hamworthy a penalty. Up steps Brandon Williams who places the ball to the left of Bridport's goalkeeper Archie Kershaw who make a terrific penalty save to deny Hamworthy the winner. And there was still time for more drama as with just seconds remaining on the clock, Hamworthy Utd's delivered corner was headed goal bound by Ollie White and cleared off the line, but the assistant referee indicated an infringement in the box, which after speaking with the referee, saw another penalty awarded for handball. LEO DEMIRA took charge of the penalty this time and with the last kick of the game confidently slotted the ball home from the spot in the 96th minute to win the match.

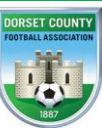

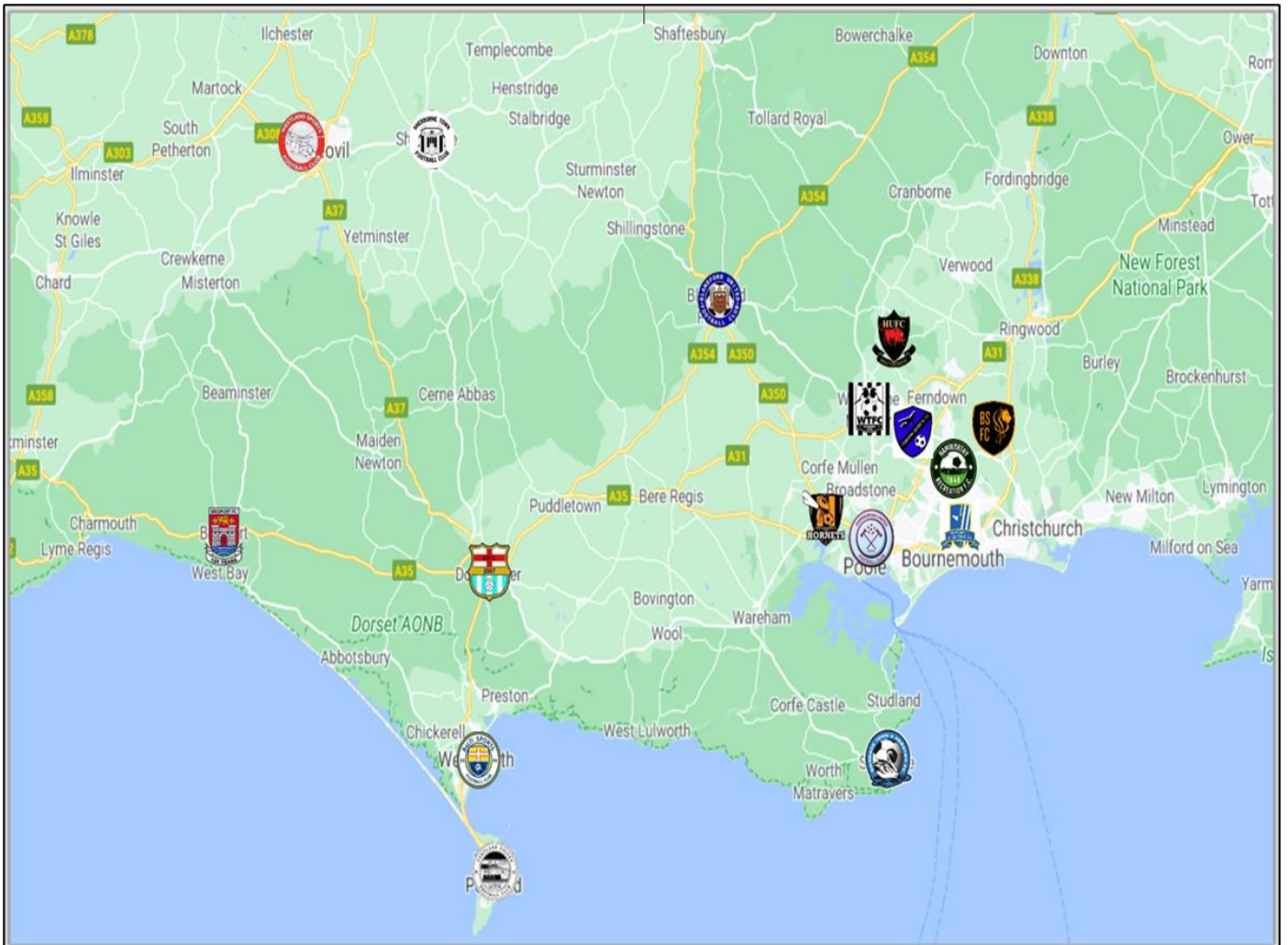
